

Are you needing a "lift-me-up?" The shorter days and the oncoming winter can be a tough time for people. Covid is still interfering with our lives. Getting frustrated by what you see and hear about?

At bible study last week, we remarked on the biblical texts for Reformation Sunday. They were messages of hope and grace. It was an unabashed reminder of the main message of the bible and of our proclamation of who God is. God wants good for us! And God enacts good for us.

The bible does not shy away from acknowledgement of the bad. There is plenty of bad news articulating human sinfulness and its inevitable results. But the future is clear for those of faith. Keep faith, therefore, and celebrate the goodness of God.

Scripture is powerful in its' ability to give us hope and peace. Yes, there are times for tears and anger and frustration, but God will not let those times last. Yes, sometimes we might not see any reason for hope. But in God, there is always reason for hope. It is the surety of God's promises and God's faithfulness to them. As God says in Jeremiah 31:33: "I will be their God and they will be my people".

This doesn't mean we have to be happy all the time. No one functions that way. But our faith can always lift us up into hope, and into the peace of knowing that the final victory against evil is assured.

Live into this knowledge. Keep these promises close to you. Let your soul rest in them so that the song of your heart may never be diminished. Live in the peace that God graciously offers to us.

And then let that inner peace shine! Our world is in a great need of some hope right now, and there is good news for them. We have a message that they are yearning to hear. Speak of the hope and the trust that you have and invite them to see the difference it can make. Show them the difference that faith can have in our lives here and now.

Our lives can be a catalyst for the casting away of the clouds of gloom and shining of God's glory into our world. May Christ's Church share this gift in this time of need!

SMLC Congregational Meeting Sunday, Nov. 14


A Congregational Meeting will be held after worship on Sunday, November 14. The agenda will include approving our 2022 Budget. Please plan to attend.

Pastor Report

- Will add this to the newsletter to welcome them.
- First communion class was postponed per Pastor's quarantine.
- Working on a proposal for tech upgrade.
- Vacation dates of November 1st through the 7th, Pastor Zajac will be covering.

Treasurer Report

- Still in a positive cash flow
- Giving above budget

Committee Reports

- Outreach: the Webster Museum project has been postponed because of lack of supplies.
- Property: repainting of the cross outside by Paul and Doug.
- Music and Worship: Bell Choir has started.
- Evangelism: lots of repeat visitors in attendance, some from a local church that has closed.

New Business

- Council of Churches hasn't been well attended and is thinking of disbanding, unfortunately this includes all the activities associated with it.
- Building Use: needs a new committee formed to replace members that are not in attendance anymore:
 - Large discussion on how to handle mask requirements
 - Also large number of scout troops wanting to use the building: this will increase heating bill in the colder months
 - Troop #110 grandfathered in as we sponsor this troop
 - Should we limit number that can use the church?
 - Start charging a small fee to cover costs? Invite contribution?
 - Masks worn at all times when a group has children involved?

Pastor Report

- Pastor Korey thanked Pastor Greg and the church's flexibility to help out during his illness.
- Pastor made a motion to accept the Zajacs as members. Sally seconded it and was approved.
- First communion classes have started. A confirmation class is scheduled for Sunday 10/24 at 6:30 pm.
- Pastor presented a proposal to upgrade our video system.
 We will also look into audio. Possibly all wireless. The
 Memorial fund can pay for this project.

Property Report

- Al Neels reported the thermostat was replaced for \$50.
- The duct work in the Sunday school building was cleaned out
- There are no exhaust fans in the bathrooms in the Sunday school building due to the roofers error.
- There is a reverse fan to vent heat from the Sunday school building. The cover must be off in the summer when being used. It is in the furnace room. The cover is replaced in the winter.
- Al bought material to separate the two garage areas. One for church and one for tenants. Both can be locked.
- Sally asked to be able to heat the sewing room. There is an old heater in there that needs replacing and/or possibly can use the wing heating.

New Business

- We reviewed the budget for 2022 and made a few adjustments. It will be given to the congregation 11/07 and voted on 11/14.
- Council election- Sally is stepping down from Faith Formation. Laura is stepping down from Treasurer, Lorrilyn is stepping down from Worship, Nancy is stepping down from Community Life. 
